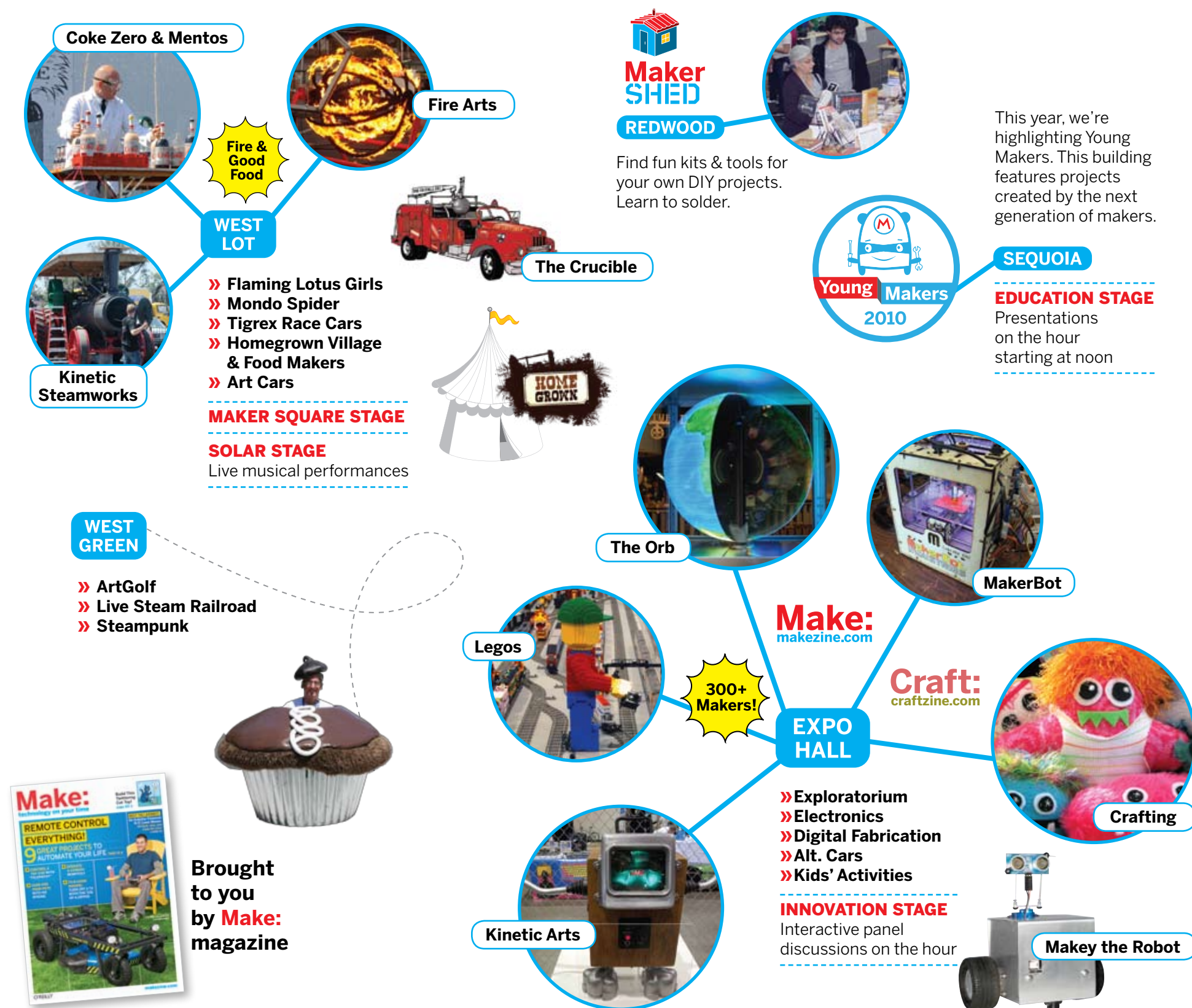

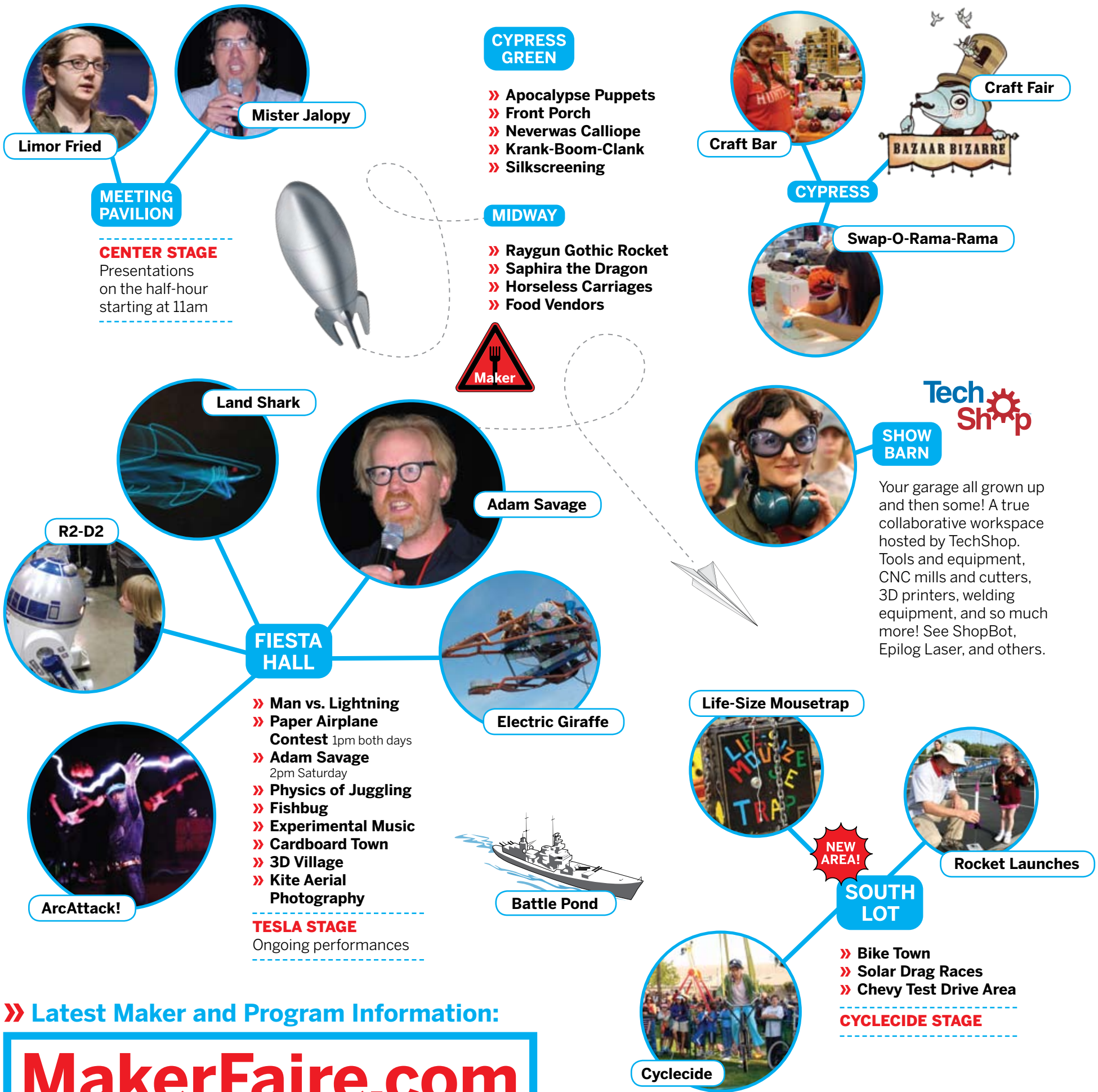
Come feel young at Maker Faire, full of new ideas, fresh faces, and cool projects.
